With an enrollment of just over 1,300 kids, we are proud to say that Aptos Athletics was able to get over 800 different students engaged in at least one sport last year!

In the last 2 years, Aptos has added 3 new sport offerings which include Girls Beach Volleyball, Girls Lacrosse, and Girls Flag Football, bringing our total offering to 32 different athletic programs between both boys and girls sports, and over 60 teams, including JV and Freshman levels.




# THIS YEAR IN SPORTS

#### The Pat Lovell Award Update

Each year, the Pat Lovell Award honors the SCCAL school with the best overall record in all varsity sports combined.

This award was established in 2019 to honor the legacy of longtime SCCAL Commissioner Pat Lovell, who helmed the SCCAL for 30 years. Points are awarded for 1st place, 2nd place, 3rd place, etc., in the final league standings for every varsity sport. The school with the highest point total at the end of each year is awarded the Pat Lovell Trophy.

In 2023-24, Aptos High won the Pat Lovell Award for a 4th time. Good luck to our Mariners again this year!

Olof Arvidson, a Foreign Exchange student from Sweden, graduated from AHS in 1997. He played basketball and ran track at Aptos, but he entrenched himself firmly into AHS Track & Field lore when he tied for 6th place in the high jump at the 1997 SCCAL Track & Field Championships, earning ½ point, and providing Aptos with a ½ point advantage over SLV to win our 1st boys championship in 17 years.

Recently, back in Sweden, he placed 3rd and earned a Bronze Medal at the 2024 Swedish Powerlifting Championships, Open Division. Olof's total from his three lifts (squat, bench & deadlift) was 1,686 lbs! Gratulerar Olof!



BUDGET ESTIMATE: \$400,000 EARNED TO DATE: \$200,000







### THIS PERIOD IN APTOS HIGH HISTORY






On Monday, September 8, 1969, Aptos High officially opened its doors to students. The enrollment of 981 students included 275 frosh, 272 sophomores, 252 juniors, and 182 seniors.

Friday, September 18, 1969, marked the 1st football game in AHS history. Playing under the lights at Cabrillo College, and led by head coach Wayne Johnson, the Mariners lost to Gonzales HS 29-6. Phil Hayes scored the school's 1st TD on a 2-yard plunge.

Boys Water-Polo played its first game on Saturday, November 20, 1971. Participating in a 4-team tournament at Cabrillo College, Aptos went 3-0 to capture the title, beating Santa Cruz 9-5, Soquel 14-8, and Carmel 4-3. **Greg Henning** was our leading scorer.

Girls Water-Polo played their 1st game on Tuesday, September 24, 1996, also at Cabrillo. The Mariners beat Hollister 24-6, and Corey **Schell** led all scorers with 7 goals.

A: From 1996 thru 2015, the **Aptos HS Girls Track & Field** Team did not lose a dual meet. Over a span of 18 years, they won 118 consecutive dual meets. It is the 2nd-longest dual meet win streak in California history.
