
Aptos saw 6 student-athletes sign Letters of Intent to continue their sports careers in college:

This past September, Peter Mel ('87) caught the biggest wave of the season at Mavericks. In 2021, Peter caught what is called "the best wave ever surfed at Mavericks", which the World Surf League named The Ride of the Year.

Last October, **Judi Oyama** ('77) was selected to the 2024 USA Slalom Skateboarding Team, and will represent the USA at the World Skate Games in Rome in September. In August, she placed 2nd at the US National Championships.

Tyler LaTorre ('01), the head baseball coach at Westmont College, was recently honored at the 38th annual Hot Stove of Santa Clara Valley banquet, at a sold-out event with more than 600 people in attendance. In 2023, Tyler led the Warriors to a 48-9 record and to the NAIA National Championship, earning NAIA Coach of the Year honors.

Former head Girls Volleyball coach, Mark Brewer, who is now the head volleyball official in Santa Cruz County, was recently honored by the CCS with the Golden Whistle Award for his contributions as an extraordinary volleyball official for over 30 years.

APTOS ALUMS IN THE NEWS

Aptos grad and longtime Aptos coach Zach Hewett ('03) was recently announced as the new head football coach, replacing the legendary Randy Blankenship. As a student-athlete, Zach was an All-SCCAL linebacker, a league champion in the discus, and captain of both teams. He was the head JV coach for nine years.

This past July, Nikki Hiltz (13), running at the Monaco Diamond League Meet, set the American record in the mile (4:16.35), breaking Mary Decker Slaney's record, which stood for 38 years. And in January, at the University of Washington, Nikki set another American record, this time in the indoor 1000 meters (2:34.09), breaking a record that was 19 years old.

Trent Dilfer ('90) recently completed his first year as head coach at the University of Alabama, Birmingham. In his inaugural year leading UAB, the Blazers went 4-8, going 4-2 at home, which included big wins over the University of South Florida (USF) and Temple University.

RECENT PROJECTS

At the end of 2023, **Aptos BBQ owner and Mariner parent, Lawrence Ingram**, partnered with the ASF to give the Aptos Junior High gym a historic makeover. Spearheaded by Mr. Ingram and Volcan Coatings, the gym walls were painted for the first time and the floor was refurbished. The project took eight days, over two phases.

The new floor coating is NBA approved, and used on both Golden State and Santa Cruz Warriors' courts.

Also working with Mr. Ingram, the ASF completed a remodel of the stadium Snack Shack, completely redesigning the interior and bringing the facility up to the new building code standards.

And, thanks to the team at **Testorff Construction**, and with the help of the Aptos High Woodshop class, Mariner Softball received a new equipment shed.
