Currently enjoying the summer season on campus, where it has been great to see many of our Mariner teams taking advantage of our facilities during the offseason, and they have been working hard! The 2023-24 school and athletic year was a busy, fun, and successful year for our studentathletes. With an enrollment of just over 1,300 kids, we are proud to say that Aptos Athletics was able to get over 800 different students engaged in at least one sport last year!



In the last 2 years, Aptos has added 3 new sport offerings which include Girls Beach Volleyball, Girls Lacrosse, and Girls Flag Football, bringing our total offering to 32 different athletic programs between both boys and girls sports, and over 60 teams, including JV and Freshman levels. It was an extremely successful school year and the momentum has carried into Summer training and camps!

Starting in July, Aptos Athletics will roll out a new athletic website, aptosathletics.com. This new site will be an update from our old website, and will be a one stop shop for the community to access schedules, rosters, and updates on athletic happenings.

In addition to signing her NLI to Menlo College, three-time SCCAL wrestling champion, Janie Houser recently won the 2024 California USA Junior Freestyle State Championship. Wrestling at 130lbs., Janie went 5-0 to earn her 1st state title. In the finals in Fresno, Janie defeated Mason Harsch of Concord in a 10-0 technical fall.

Baseball player Gabe Gaeckle ('23), now pitching for the University of Arkansas, earned Freshman All-American honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. Gabe led the Razorbacks in saves and had a 2.32 ERA. He was also named to the 1st-team All-SEC Freshman Team.

Hoopster Cole Welle ('14), a past SCCAL MVP and Cal Golden Bear, recently completed his 5th season playing for Team Umea in the Swedish Professional Basketball League. Cole averaged 6.2 ppg and 6.6 rpg, with a high of 13 points against Sodertalje and against Boras.

AHS Sports Hall of Fame member **Tyler LaTorre** ('01) was just announced as the new head baseball coach at Pepperdine University. Just two years removed from leading Westmont University to the NAIA National Championship and being named NAIA National Coach-of-the-Year, Tyler signed with the Waves. In two years coaching Westmont, Tyler achieved an 81-24-3 (.750) overall record.

APTOS ALUMS IN THE NEWS

Former Aptos QB Cody Townsend ('01) is now an award-winning freeskier and backcountry adventurer, and he was recently profiled in GQ Magazine, which highlighted his FIFTY Project. Cody is ascending (on foot), and skiing down, the fifty most renowned mountain descents in North America. No helicopter, no snowmobiles. In addition, Cody's video of "The Crack", dubbed "one of the craziest lines in ski history", has been viewed almost three million times.

Former Aptos FB player and school record-holder in the shot put, strongman Robert Oberst ('03) recently retired from the World's Strongest Man circuit. Robert, who has deadlifted 793 lbs. and overhead pressed an American record 465 lbs. in the Log Lift, finished in the Top 10 of the World's Strongest Man competition two-times, and also finished 2nd in America's Strongest Man twice. After starring in the History Channel's reality hit "The Strongest Man in History", Robert segued to drama, making his debut as Karl Montgomery last year in HBO's "The Righteous Gemstones".


THIS PERIOD IN APTOS HIGH HISTORY

On Friday, June 12, 1970, the 1st graduating class of Aptos High received their diplomas from principal Richard Cunnison. The ceremony was held in the gym, and speeches were given by valedictorian Karen Angelos and salutatorian Thomas Matheson.

In May of 1973, Aptos sophomore **Rick Downey ('75)** set the Seascape Golf Course record, shooting a round of 64, including 30 on the back nine. That record was finally broken by former Seascape golf pro Jeff McMillian in 1985, who shot a 63. However, a year earlier, as a frosh, Rick shot 29 on the front nine, and that record still stands.

On May 17, 1980, by beating SLV in the last game of the season, the Mariners won their 1st SCCAL Baseball Championship. Aptos and Santa Cruz were tied going into the last game, but Harbor upset the Cardinals 4-2, and Aptos beat the Cougars 2-0. Mike Leon hit a solo HR in the 3rd, Mike Green drove-in **Phil Ingram** with a sac fly in the 4th, and **Kevin Daily** threw a 2-hitter to get the win.

In May of 2009, the AHS Girls Track & Field Team won their record-setting 13th straight SCCAL Championship, and 6 years later, in 2015, they set the record for the 2nd longest dual meet win streak in CA history. They went 18 years without a loss.
